
#### Action Highlights April 2023



- » Creating a web-based, inter-disciplinary training module system for providers across Hawai'i to better address the needs of people with perinatal substance use disorder
  - Secured initial funding and gathered stakeholder feedback
  - Participating in SMALLIFY accelerator
- » Engaging with key partners to create materials and strategize approach to ensure insurance confidentiality for sensitive health care services



Navigate Landscape



- » Makua Ally now working on Hawai`i Island as of Feb 2023, in addition to Oʻahu-based Makua Ally
- » Pursuing breastfeeding health equity activities with DOH and HIPHI funding/partnership
  - » Assessment of current hospital maternity care practices, barriers and training/technical assistance needs
  - » Review of existing maternity care hospital recognition programs and cultural recommendations
  - Community organization needs assessment
  - Statewide messaging and data gathering via SMS text
  - Breastfeeding promotion in childcare settings

Shift Awareness, Narrative, and Culture

- » LATCH\* grant initiative: Gathering community insights around ways to enhance reimbursement for lactation support
  - Conducted focus groups with diverse stakeholders
  - Launched family survey
  - Engaging with insurance partners to move work forward in SMALLIFY accelerator

- » Advocating for expanded abortion access and protections for abortion care providers and patients
  - » Act 2 (SB1) signed into law March 22, 2023.

Comprehensive Literacy State Development Grant (CLSD)

- » LENA implementation continues statewide through the Words Matter partnership
  - These implementation efforts will mean that some 300 young children will be served by LENA programming

- » Engaged in a series of small group and team conversations to hone an agenda for 2023
- » Focusing on early language and literacy development as a key pillar of successful early childhood transitions
- » Established a shared desire to engage in a collective project that would allow multiple agencies and service providers to align their efforts around early language and literacy development
- » The team is eager to focus on developing a coordinated statewide early literacy coordinator position and scope of work



Strengthen Crosssector Leadership

» Working with early childhood and public education leaders to develop a communitybased early-childhood continuum of partners working to support the health, safety, and early learning of all children in the communities of Waimanalo and Pahoa
