



Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs)



Among young women (Age 18-29) rates of IPV are 55% higher for Native Hawaiians than among non-Hawaiian women.

Higher rates of family violence among Native Hawaiians cannot be divorced from oppressive external conditions such as colonization, denial of self-determination, racialized systems and structures, and economic stress.








Children from foodinsecure households have higher body mass index, waist circumference, and greater odds of being classified as overweight or obese.

Food insecurity is associated with increased risks of some birth defects, anemia, lower nutrient intakes, cognitive problems, and aggression and anxiety.




